

Project Worker

Role Description

We are seeking a dedicated Project Worker to join our team. The ideal candidate will have a deep compassion for children and an unwavering commitment to enriching their lives. We are offering a contract for services to work on a sessional or project basis. Most sessions are about 3 hours long (usually morning or afternoon) and most projects run for at least 6-8 weeks. The role is in the region of Swansea, working mostly on-site with some remote work included.

Responsibilities

- Collaborate with our Senior Project Worker on a project run by Adenydd. This role involves working directly with young children, leading them through engaging activities that promote their development and expose them to a diverse range of experiences.
- Tailor the support you provide to the children to suit their feelings and needs to positively engage with the children providing encouragement, compassion, empathy, and enthusiasm.
- Create a safe, nurturing, and supportive environment through therapeutic sessions and activities for vulnerable children and/or parents, promoting sensory regulation, emotional expression, and skill development (physical, cognitive, and emotional) for all, fostering their overall well-being.
- Regularly monitor and evaluate the progress of children, adjusting interventions as necessary.
- Contribute to the evaluation of projects and report writing for funders.

Essential Qualities, Experience and Qualifications

- Patience, resilience, and calmness.
- Passion, enthusiasm, and commitment.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Good analytical and problem-solving skills.
- Good time management skills including ability to prioritise.

Desirable Experience and Qualifications

- Experience working with children who have developmental trauma.
- Knowledge of trauma-informed care and evidence-based therapeutic approaches
- Qualification in Psychology, Social Work, Therapeutic Interventions, Counselling, or a related field.
- Training in the BUSS model, The Just Right State Programme, Theraplay, DDP, PECS or other attachment or trauma-focused interventions.
- Professional registration in therapeutic practices (e.g., BACP, UKCP, DDP, Theraplay) is desirable, if appropriate.
